Hole #18 bulk head repair has been completed this past month. While the company was out, we also leveled areas on holes #9 and #6 to prevent further erosion.

Tree trimming has been done around the course, most notably on hole #2. These trees were blocking sunlight from reaching the green, thus causing lengthier frost delays.

Out of bounds stakes have been moved on the right side of hole #7 to reflect the property line stakes. The tee shot on #7 is much more daunting now!
