2025 Ryder Cup:

The next and final event of the 2025 season will be the RYDER CUP that will be played on Sunday, November 16th. This will be a single-day event, where 3 different 9-hole rounds will be played. The captains for the Ryder Cup are Robert Spizzo and Jeff Bell. Robert won the 2025 match play event back in September, and Jeff is our most recent champion from the Club Championship. There is a lot of information that can be gone over for this event, so if you have any questions about it, please don't hesitate to reach out to Brian Joyner or myself. I will try to go over a few key items here right now...

Ryder Cup Info

- All members (men AND women) are welcome and encouraged to play
- The price for entry is \$40 + an 18-hole cart fee if you are not on the cart plan
- Everyone who signs up for the Ryder Cup will be selected onto either Team Spizzo or Team Bell
- The 3 formats for the 27-hole day are: 9-hole shotgun (Alternate shot), then another 9-hole shotgun (Best Ball), and to finish, another 9-hole shotgun (singles where you will play against players of similar handicap)
- The final day to sign up for this event is next Thursday, the 13th. Teams will then be selected on Friday, and pairings sent out on Saturday. The Alternate shot and Best Ball pairings will be made at random and handicaps will be applied to each pairing, and then singles (individual matches) will be based off of handicap index.
- You can sign up for this event through the member portal (also where you make online tee times) or by emailing myself or Brian. We already have a lot of interest in the event, and we ask for some help... Even if you have already told someone on staff that you'd like to play, PLEASE make sure to let us know again as we want to make sure you are accounted for and no one was missed.

This is going to be SO MUCH FUN! OH, I forgot to mention, when you sign up, you could have a chance to play with Brian or myself as Brian will be on one team and I will be on the other.

The greens have recovered nicely since aerification this past month. If you played in the Club Championship you may have noticed the increase in green speed. We have lowered the mow height on the greens, and they'll continue to roll true throughout the winter time.

Our top tier of the driving range has been overseeded with rye grass. As soon as the Bermuda goes dormant we'll switch to that tier. The areas around the Clubhouse have also been overseeded to keep the lawn looking good in the cooler months.

I'll start my fall pre-emergent this week. This application is important to keep crabgrass, goose grass, poa annua, and other weeds from germinating.
